## Pacifica Islanders Gain Big Yardage for the Little Brown Church

The Pacifica Community Museum (also known as the Little Brown Church) restoration project got a tremendous boost Saturday, Dec. 19, when Pacific Islanders football team players, staff and family members removed deteriorating lath and plaster from the walls and ceiling of the main part of the building. The interior is now ready for installing new electrical lines and plumbing to bring the 99-year-old structure into conformance with building codes.

The scrap from this day of intense effort filled a large debris box generously donated by Coastside Scavenger plus the back of a truck provided by the 4F Group, local contractors.

Activities such as this are part of the "giving back to the community" ethic of the Northern California Football League. League Commissioner Gus Lopez emphasized the importance of this by coming by and spending some time with us.
